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**Application Packet  
2009-10 Scholarship Program**

This scholarship is offered in memory of the late Barbara Hunter Randall Joseph, a long-time member of the American Studies faculty at SUNY College at Old Westbury.

Students applying for this award must meet the following criteria and/or complete the following information:

- Open to currently enrolled, new incoming freshman, and transfer students who will be matriculated at SUNY College at Old Westbury during the 2009-10 academic year.
- Must possess an 80 high school average (for freshman applicants) or a 3.0 grade point average (at the time of applying for currently enrolled or transfer applicants). A 3.0 grade point average must be maintained during the 2009-10 academic year for the award to be posted to the account(s) of the awardee(s).
- An original, two- to four-page essay detailing their social justice activities, outlining their motivation for the activities and outcomes learned from the experience.
- Two letters of recommendation.
- Though financial need is not a requirement, students should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) with the Office of Financial Aid

***NOTE: Applications for this award are forwarded to a committee comprised of friends, colleagues and family and Dr. Joseph, which conducts the review and makes the award selection.***

## **General Requirements for All Scholarships at SUNY College at Old Westbury**

*(Specific requirements noted on the cover of this application may supersede the general requirements noted here. In the absence of specific requirements for this scholarship, the College's general requirements apply).*

### **I. Eligibility**

- A. Applicants must be registered as a current full-time matriculated SUNY College at Old Westbury student, unless otherwise specified.
- B. Applicants must have a minimum SUNY College at Old Westbury GPA of 3.0, unless otherwise specified.
- C. Graduating seniors who will only be attending the fall semester may apply. If the graduating senior is the chosen recipient, he/she will only receive one half the award.
- D. Applicants must submit an original essay, 500 words minimum, based on a specified topic. Send your essay on a disk in Microsoft Word, along with a printed copy.

### **II. Criteria for Selection**

- A. The Standing Scholarship Committee Board will review all applications.
- B. The applicant's essay is an essential factor in selecting scholarship recipients.
- C. **The Committee will judge essays for composition, conveying thoughts accurately and precisely, grammar and spelling.**

### **III. Limitations**

- A. Scholarship awards may only be used toward the college costs at SUNY College at Old Westbury and are posted to the awardees account with the Office of the Bursar, unless otherwise specified.
- B. The award will be disbursed in two equal amounts. The first half will be issued during the fall semester and the remaining half in the spring semester. **Recipients will receive the spring semester's award only if he/she continues to fulfill the scholarship requirements.**
- C. If the recipient is a graduating senior, the final semester's award will not exceed the cost of tuition and fees.
- D. If a student is awarded more than one scholarship award, the total amount of all the awards may not exceed the student's tuition and fees.
