



THE JERMAINE CAMP AWARD

Application Packet 2009-10 Scholarship Program

In honor of the late SGA President-elect, Jermaine Camp, who died tragically in 2004, the College's Office of First Year Experience and the Faculty Senate award modest book scholarships of \$100 each to three outstanding students each year.

Students applying for this award must meet the following criteria and/or complete the following information:

- Open to currently matriculated SUNY College at Old Westbury student of at least second-semester freshman standing during the 2009-10 academic year.
- Full-time or Part-time students may apply.
- Must have at least a 3.0 grade point average (based on a 4 point system) at the time of applying.
- In 200 words, candidate must provide a written essay on the role of students in Old Westbury's governance.
- Two letters of recommendation from faculty on official letterhead.
- Though financial need is not a requirement, students should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) with the Office of Financial Aid

Application Due: Friday, April 24, 2009

Applications must be post-marked or dropped off by the end of the business day. Incomplete and late applications will not be accepted. You may drop off your applications and the related required material to the Office of Academic Affairs, room H-213 Campus Center or mail to:

General Requirements for All Scholarships at SUNY College at Old Westbury

(Specific requirements noted on the cover of this application may supersede the general requirements noted here. In the absence of specific requirements for this scholarship, the College's general requirements apply).

I. Eligibility

- A. Applicants must be registered as a current full-time matriculated SUNY College at Old Westbury student, unless otherwise specified.
- B. Applicants must have a minimum SUNY College at Old Westbury GPA of 3.0, unless otherwise specified.
- C. Graduating seniors who will only be attending the fall semester may apply. If the graduating senior is the chosen recipient, he/she will only receive one half the award.
- D. Applicants must submit an original essay, 500 words minimum, based on a specified topic. Send your essay on a disk in Microsoft Word, along with a printed copy.

II. Criteria for Selection

- A. The Standing Scholarship Committee Board will review all applications.
- B. The applicant's essay is an essential factor in selecting scholarship recipients.
- C. **The Committee will judge essays for composition, conveying thoughts accurately and precisely, grammar and spelling.**

III. Limitations

- A. Scholarship awards may only be used toward the college costs at SUNY College at Old Westbury and are posted to the awardees account with the Office of the Bursar, unless otherwise specified.
- B. The award will be disbursed in two equal amounts. The first half will be issued during the fall semester and the remaining half in the spring semester. **Recipients will receive the spring semester's award only if he/she continues to fulfill the scholarship requirements.**
- C. If the recipient is a graduating senior, the final semester's award will not exceed the cost of tuition and fees.
- D. If a student is awarded more than one scholarship award, the total amount of all the awards may not exceed the student's tuition and fees.
