

New York State Teaching Certification Requirements

NOTE: The edTPA is not required for **M.S. candidates** because they already hold initial NYS certification. The edTPA is to be completed by **B.A., B.S., M.A.T., and Adv. Cert candidates** during the semester they are enrolled in student teaching. It is highly recommended that you complete all other exams and workshops prior to the semester you student teach.

Initial Certification: Completed a NYS Approved Teacher Preparation Pathway Program, Pass All NYSTCE Exams, Completed ALL Required Workshops, and Fingerprints

Professional Certification: Have Completed a RELATED MASTER'S or HIGHER DEGREE and Have Three Years Teaching Experience
