What is a "GPA" and how is it calculated?

GPA stands for "Grade Point Average." A GPA is the average of all of the grade points you have earned throughout the course of your degree. When your student receives a letter grade, that grade equates to a number (see chart below). This number is then multiplied by the number of credits of that particular course and then divided by the total number of credits earned.

Letter Grade	4.0 Scale GPA
A+	4.0
Α	4.0

So, if your student took 3- 4 credit courses in the fall, a GPA calculation looks like this: Course 1: A (4x4)= 16 Course 2: B+ (4x 3.3)= 13.2 Course 3: A- (4x3.7)= 14.8 Total Grade Points Earned= 44 Divided by total credits earned (12)= 3.67 Term GPA
