Justice for Fraud Victims Project Launched by School of Business

The State University of New York at Old Westbury School of Business Master's in Forensic Accounting program and the Long Island Chapter of the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners are launching the Justice for Fraud Victims Project; which will work to assist victims of suspected financial fraud in cases where forensic investigative services are limited or too costly.

"Having a fraud examination by a fraud or accounting professional often can be too expensive for many victims, especially small business owners, non-for-profit organizations, and the like" said Professor David Glodstein, lead professor of the College's graduate forensic accounting. "We will be working with our community so that our students can become a force multiplier for victims while gaining valuable experience for themselves". The College is now reaching out to form partnerships with law enforcement officials, prosecutors, local Certified Fraud Examiners and forensic accountants to develop the network through which cases will be referred



"We are excited to help bring the Justice for Fraud Victims Project to the public" said Dottie Morelli, president of the <u>Long Island Chapter of the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners</u>. "This is an important initiative that gives fraud victims a way to fight back and an avenue to receive some restitution of financial loss".
