# Accounting Recruitment Program: All Accounting students are encouraged to participate

The School of Business is running an **Accounting Recruitment Program** from September 2 through early
November 2019 for undergraduate and graduate
Accounting students. This program permits Junior and
Senior Accounting majors to have their resumes mailed
out to participating accounting firms for an opportunity
for either an on-campus or in-house interview, and to
attend the Accounting Networking Reception on
Thursday, October 17, 2019.



The <u>Accounting Networking Reception</u> is a job fair that provides Accounting students an opportunity to meet with local, regional and national Accounting firms and submit their resumes to them. In order to attend this job fair, undergraduate students will be required to attend 1 out of 5 <u>Career Workshops</u> that are being offered. Graduate students are waived from the workshop requirement.

Several well-known regional and national CPA firms have agreed to accept resumes from our Accounting students who will be graduating in December 2019, May 2020 and August 2020. There may also be internship opportunities for students graduating in 2021.
