*At the most recent AACSB Global Accreditation Conference held in San Antonio, Texas, the first draft of proposed AACSB Standards was presented to seek formal feedback. AACSB International is an elite accreditation enjoyed by less than 15% of business schools in the world. The SOB at OW is in the process of attaining this accreditation while serving our Mission and our students with a singular devotion to teaching and learning.*



*Based upon the current 2013 Standards, an institution must align with a set of 15 business standards to earn and sustain business accreditation. The proposed 2020 Standards ([Business Accreditation Task Force](#)) include modifications and the consolidations of some accreditation standards. Continuing to emphasize the themes of **engagement, innovation, and impact**, **AACSB's** draft proposes nine standards organized within three sections: Strategic Management, Learner Success, and Thought Leadership.*

*The new standards are expected to be more principles-based rather than prescriptive. Standards 2020 will be revised in February 2020 and subjected to a membership vote of ratification in April 2020. While these proposed standards do not affect our initial self-evaluation report (iSER), we will continue to obtain guidance from our Mentor. Stay tuned!*
