Challenging Education: Extreme Learners

Are you an Extreme Learner?

In <u>Education Week</u>, Milton Chen writes describing the notion of extreme learning and provides guidance on becoming an <u>Extreme Learner</u>. Chen is the chair of **Panasonic Foundation** and a **Senior Fellow** at the **George Lucas Educational Foundation**. Chen explains that extreme learners may not be the people with the highest GPAs, but they love learning at its own sake and spend their lives seeking opportunities to learn new things. In addition, extreme learners forge their own path; they tend to be highly motivated and willing to go outside traditional pathways to pursue their interests. Chen posits that extreme learners constantly ask questions because they have a

strong sense of curiosity, and their interests tend to span fields across disciplines. Extreme learners find role models, mentors, and people whom they can learn from. Extreme learners use technology to support their learning and take full advantage of the internet's educational opportunities. Finally, Chen concludes that, extreme learners work on developing their soft skills of collaboration, leadership, and resilience.
