Leadership "Derailers"

Kerry Goyette, the author of *The Non-Obvious Guide to Emotional Intelligence* posits possible "derailers" of leadership that every good leader must guard against. She states that conflict avoidance in one such derailer that results from inherent insecurities and usually manifests itself as intimidation. Secondly, impulsiveness often evokes unpredictable emotions of anger and a quick decision based on impulse rather than sound rationale. Blame shifting leads to leaders focusing on the negative and shirking accountability. Leaders trying to avoid failure often do so because they have issues yielding control and consequently micromanaging teams. Perfectionism leads to missed deadlines and opportunities. Power hungry leaders hoard resources and their teams usually perceive them to be selfish. Power hungry leaders tend to make snap decisions and alienate the people around them. Once a leader successfully identifies a potential "derailer," they can strategize to overcome them, Goyette mentions. Better communication and enhanced trust lead to reducing the ill effects of derailers. The SOB at SUNY OW strives to grow leaders with knowledge, skills, and values that produce effective teams and optimal outcomes.
