Dean's Message

Impediments to Effective Communication

Julian Treasure, a communication coach, identifies some common impediments to effective organizational communication. First, the urge to look good leads to pretense that renders all communication insincere. Secondly, a know-it-all stalls any productive communication, valuable meeting time is then lost to self-aggrandization. Listening to learn is more valuable than listening to respond. Always needing to be right stalls communication due to the demands it places on self and others. "Most importantly, interruptions can make your colleagues feel belittled or resentful," Treasure warns. In order to be liked one might agree with ideas they don't really think will work. "When you feel pressured to acquiesce to others' needs, use your core values to guide your response," Treasure suggests. Driven by emotions one might not allow for two-way conversations in which all thoughts are clearly and thoroughly expressed. "When your team members encounter difficult life events, show them that you understand what they're going through," he adds. These insights are valuable to us in the SOB, since developing effective communication skills in our students is a foundational tenet of the SOB Mission.
