he SUNY Old Westbury School of Business is proud to announce **Prof. David Glodstein's** selection to the **Long Island Business News Power 25 List in Education** in their December 11-17, 2020 issue. Prof. Glodstein was cited for the **real-world learning opportunities** he provides for his students.

Prof. Glodstein is a hardworking, dedicated and innovative professor who served as the driving force behind the 2018 launch of the SUNY Old Westbury's SOB Master of Science in Forensic Accounting. This is the only graduate forensic accounting program on Long Island.

In addition, Prof. Glodstein, working with the Long Island Chapter of the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners, law enforcement and forensic accountants, founded the **Justice for Fraud Victims Project** (JFVP) in fall 2019. This exciting project provides real-world applied learning opportunities for students while leveraging expertise from higher education, law enforcement and forensic accountants. The JFVP assists victims of suspected financial fraud in cases where forensic investigative services are limited or too costly. SUNY Old Westbury SOB students are giving the opportunity to develop hands on forensic accounting skills while fraud fighting with professionals. We congratulate Prof. Glodstein on this honor.
